HIGH PATHOGENICITY AVIAN INFLUENZA (H5N1) IN USA

USA reported outbreaks of high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI) in poultry in the following regions listed below.

- i. Grant County, Kansas
- ii. Roosevelt County, New Mexico
- In view of the outbreaks, the National Parks Board/Animal & Veterinary Service (NParks/AVS) will impose a temporary restriction on the importation of ornamental birds, poultry and poultry products from the 10km radius restricted area around the affected premises with effect from the respective dates as stated below. Heat-treated poultry products which comply with the WOAH guidelines for inactivation of AI virus will not be subjected to the restriction.

Region(s)	Effective date of temporary restriction
Grant County, Kansas (10km)	10 April 2024
Roosevelt County, New Mexico (10km)	12 April 2024

3 Poultry consignments exported from the affected areas in the following regions, that meet the following slaughter and export dates will continue to be accepted for import.

Region(s)	Slaughter date	Export date
Grant County, Kansas (10km)	Before 27 March 2024	Before 10 April 2024
Roosevelt County, New Mexico (10km)	Before 29 March 2024	Before 12 April 2024

- In order to facilitate the clearance of permits for poultry and poultry products, we would require the following attestations to be included in the veterinary health certificate accompanying the import of poultry and poultry products:
 - a) Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) is a notifiable disease in the United States.





- b) The birds from which the meat was sourced were not vaccinated against HPAI, as defined by the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH).
- c) The poultry meat and meat products were not derived from poultry originating from areas within the 10 km radius restricted zone(s) established around a premise affected with HPAI in poultry as defined by the WOAH.
- d) The birds from which the meat was derived were hatched, raised, and slaughtered in the United States, or were legally imported as day-old chicks from countries with equivalent poultry health status.
