HIGHLY PATHOGENIC AVIAN INFLUENZA (HPAI) H5N8 IN HAUTE-CORSE, CORSICA, FRANCE

France reported an outbreak of H5N8 highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) in poultry at a pet department of a garden center located near Bastia, Haute-Corse, Corsica, France.

2 In view of the outbreak, the National Parks Board/Animal & Veterinary Service (NParks/AVS) has imposed a temporary restriction on the importation of poultry and poultry products from the department of Haute-Corse, Corsica, France with effect from 16 November 2020. Heat-treated poultry products which comply with the OIE guidelines for inactivation of AI virus will not be subjected to the restriction.

3 To facilitate the clearance of permits for poultry and poultry products, we would require the following attestations to be included in the veterinary health certificate accompanying the import of poultry and poultry products:

(a) Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) and H5 and H7 low pathogenicity avian influenza (LPAI) are notifiable diseases in France.

(b) The birds from which the meat was sourced were not vaccinated against H5 and H7 subtypes of avian influenza (AI), as defined by the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE).

(c) The poultry meat and meat products were not derived from birds originating from the department of Haute-Corse, Corsica, France.

(d) The poultry from which the meat was derived were born, raised, and slaughtered in France, or were legally imported as day old chicks from countries with equivalent poultry health status.
