

Recall of Beretta Antipasto and Beretta Coppa due to possible presence of Salmonella

The U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) has issued a notification on the recall of Beretta Antipasto and Beretta Coppa due to the possible presence of Salmonella.

2. As the implicated products were imported into Singapore, SFA has directed the importer, Indoguna (Singapore) Pte Ltd, to recall the products. The recall is ongoing.
3. Salmonella is a pathogenic bacteria that can cause food poisoning. Symptoms may include diarrhoea, abdominal pain, fever, nausea and vomiting. More information on Salmonella in food can be found at: <https://www.sfa.gov.sg/food-information/food-safety-education/food-contaminants>.
4. Consumers who have purchased the implicated product are advised not to consume it. Those who have consumed the implicated product and have concerns about their health should seek medical advice. Consumers may contact their point of purchase for enquiries.
