H5 LOW PATHOGENICITY AVIAN INFLUENZA IN SUFFOLK, UK

UK reported an outbreak of H5 low pathogenicity avian influenza (LPAI) in a commercial chicken farm in Suffolk, UK.

In view of the outbreak, the National Parks Board/Animal & Veterinary Service (NParks/AVS) has imposed a temporary restriction on the importation of birds, poultry, and poultry products from the 1 km radius restricted area around the affected premises in Suffolk, UK with effect from 10 December 2019. Heat-treated poultry products which comply with the OIE guidelines for inactivation of Avian Influenza virus will not be subjected to the restriction.

To facilitate the clearance of permits for other poultry and poultry products, the following additional attestations are required to be included in the veterinary health certificate accompanying the import of poultry and poultry products:

- (a) Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) and H5 and H7 low pathogenicity avian influenza (LPAI) are notifiable diseases in the country of export.
- (b) The birds from which the meat was sourced were not vaccinated against H5 and H7 subtypes of avian influenza (AI), as defined by the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE).
- (c) The poultry meat and meat products were not derived from birds originating from the 1 km radius restricted areas around the affected premises in Suffolk, UK
- (d) The poultry from which the meat was derived were born, raised, and slaughtered in the UK, or were legally imported as day old chicks from countries with equivalent poultry health status.
