Goh Chee Wee fined \$3,000 for illegal import of fresh vegetables

Goh Chee Wee (licensee of Daily Go Fresh) was fined a total of \$3,000 by the Court today for illegally importing fresh vegetables.

- In October 2019, officers from the Singapore Food Agency (SFA) detected 456kg of undeclared and under-declared fresh vegetables in the implicated consignments imported from Thailand by Goh Chee Wee. The illegal consignments were seized.
- 3 Illegally imported food products are of unknown sources and pose a food safety risk. In Singapore, food imports must meet SFA's requirements and food safety standards. Food can only be imported by licensed importers, and every consignment must be declared and accompanied with a valid import permit. Offenders who illegally import food shall be liable on conviction to a maximum fine of \$10,000 and/or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years.
