SFA kickstarts Phase 3 of Stakeholder Engagement for the Lim Chu Kang Master Plan to co-create an exciting vision for the area

The Singapore Food Agency (SFA) launched the third and final phase of its stakeholder engagement series where the industry and public came together to cocreate Lim Chu Kang (LCK) into Singapore's flagship agri-food production hub. This initiative is part of our ongoing efforts to invite stakeholders to share their views and ideas on how we can raise food production in a sustainable and resource-efficient manner in support of the Singapore Green Plan 2030.

- Minister for Sustainability and the Environment, Ms Grace Fu, opened the first of four sessions today. Minister Grace Fu said, "The Lim Chu Kang master plan is a milestone in our Singapore Food Story. Many of you have been with us since the start of engagement sessions this May. As we move into Phase 3 today, we will co-create solutions to collectively develop Lim Chu Kang as an attractive place for all, and more importantly, as Singapore's flagship agri-food production hub that will strengthen our food security in a productive, climate-resilient and sustainable manner."
- The Phase 3 engagement sessions, which builds on the ideas generated during the earlier phases, will be conducted between September to October 2021. Around 50 participants are expected to participate in this final phase of our engagement effort, comprising key agricultural industry players, members of the public from previous sessions, representatives from institutes of higher learning, as well as eco-system players, including agri-input companies and incubators. Participants will discuss ideas and put up recommendations on their vision of LCK along the areas of the 4 "E"s—Environment, Experience, Engagement and Economics. These include topics such as climate resilience, environmental sustainability and circularity, R&D, education and training, and discussions on how to transform LCK into an urban agri-food production hub. Participants will present their recommendations to Minister Grace Fu and Minister of State for Sustainability and the Environment, Mr Desmond Tan, at the final session in October 2021.
