Fresh Choice Avenue Pte Ltd fined \$10,000 for illegal import of fresh and processed vegetables

Fresh Choice Avenue Pte Ltd, an importer of food products, was fined \$10,000 by the Court today for illegally importing fresh fruits and vegetables and processed food for sale.

2 On 2 September 2020, officers from Singapore Food Agency (SFA) detected 349.6kg of undeclared and under-declared fresh fruits and vegetables and 304.5kg of undeclared processed vegetables in the consignments imported from Malaysia by Fresh Choice Avenue Pte Ltd. The illegal consignments were seized.

In Singapore, food imports must meet SFA's requirements. Fruits and vegetables can only be imported by licensed importers, and every consignment must be declared and accompanied with a valid import permit. Illegally imported vegetables are of unknown sources and can pose a food safety risk (e.g. if unregulated or high level of pesticides are used). The long-term ingestion of excessive pesticide residues through the consumption of vegetables that have been subjected to pesticide abuse could lead to adverse health effects.

Offenders who illegally import fresh fruits and vegetables shall be liable on conviction to a maximum fine of \$10,000 and/or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years. Offenders who illegally import processed fruits and vegetables shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 and in the case of a subsequent conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$2,000.
