Singaporean man fined for animal cruelty

A 41-year-old Singaporean man, Chiam Choon San Alan, was sentenced to a fine of S\$8,000 today for one count of animal cruelty and one count of non-compliance with dog licensing & control rules.

- On 23 May 2016, AVA was alerted to a case of a man punching and kicking his pet husky at the back of his residence. While we investigated the case, the dog was surrendered to AVA and sent to a vet clinic for medical examination. The veterinary report found that the dog suffered no external wounds/injuries, apart from an abrasion that could not be conclusively established as a result of acts of cruelty by the man. However, the incident was witnessed by a neighbour who shared video footages with AVA. We reviewed the footage, which revealed that the man had kicked, punched and held the dog up in mid-air at a choking position. Our investigation also found that the man had failed to comply with dog licensing & control rules by keeping more than 3 dogs in his premises.
- The dog is currently under the care of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA). AVA will work with SPCA to rehome the dog.

Individuals who commit animal cruelty are liable to a maximum fine of \$15,000 and/or 18 months jail term for first convictions. For non-compliance with dog licensing & control rules, individuals are liable to a maximum fine of \$5,000 upon conviction.
